Pupil Voice- Marking and Feedback Spring 2016

In KS2, 207 children completed a questionnaire about their marking and feedback in their work.

- 95% (196/207) like the marking policy because it helps them to learn and improve, they know what is good and what they need to do next, because it stands out and it is clear.
"It makes me reply and motivated to do my work"
"It helps you a lot"
"I can learn from my mistakes"
"It shows me what to do next"
"I like colours and stampers on my work"
"I get stickers to say well done"
- 5% (12/207) said that they didn't like the marking policy either because they didn't like pink, or because they did not like to get their work wrong.

How we will address the concerns of pupils that do not like the marking policy.

At Hanley St Luke's we do a lot of work explaining how important challenge in our work is, and explaining that pink does not necessarily mean wrong, but think, and move your learning on.

Staff will continue to work with children on this so that they fully understand how our marking policy helps them to learn effectively. Pupils will understand that getting things wrong means that they are learning!
