Year 1 and 2

Working Scientifically

- Ask simple questions and recognise that they can be answered in different ways.
- Observe practical investigations that use simple equipment.
- Suggests answers to questions from observations and class ideas.
- Gather and record data to help to answer questions.
- Perform simple tests in the form of an investigation.
- Identify and classify both living and non-living things.

Year 1 Key Vocabulary:

Biology:

- **Senses:** hear, smell, touch, taste, see
- **Animals:** beak, wing, paw, feathers, claw, talons
- **Main body parts:** head, neck, arms, elbows, legs, knees, face, ears, hair, mouth, teeth, abdomen, chest, shoulders, toes

- **Weather types:** sun, snow, rain, hail, wind
- **Temperature:** cold, hot, warm

Year 2 Key Vocabulary:

Year 3 and 4**Working Scientifically**

- Ask relevant questions using different types of scientific investigations.
- Set up simple practical investigations and begin to ensure that they are comparative and fair.
- Make systematic and careful observations.
- Start to take accurate measurements using standard units and a range of equipment including thermometers and data loggers.
- Gather, record, classify and present data in a variety of ways in order to answer questions.
- Use scientific language to record findings, drawings, labelled diagrams, keys, bar charts and tables.
- Use results from investigations, including oral and written explanations, displays or presentations of results and conclusions.
- Identify differences, similarities or changes in simple scientific ideas and processes.
- Use simple scientific evidence to answer questions and support findings.

Year 3 Key Vocabulary:**Biology:**

Physics:

- **Forces:** contact, non-contact, iron, force, pull, push, magnet, poles, attract, repel, magnetic, non-magnetic, metal, stronger, weaker, movement, bigger, smaller force
- **Light:** dark, absence of light, luminous, travel, reflection, reflect, shadow, see, eyes, mirror, direction, straight lines
- **Light source:** torch, sunlight, light source
- **Properties:** opaque, translucent, transparent, reflective, block

Year 5 and 6

Working Scientifically

- Plan different types of scientific investigation to answer questions, ensuring that variables are recognised and controlled when necessary.
- Begin to take increasing accurate and precise measurements, using a range of scientific equipment and repeat readings when required.
- Record data and results increasing in complexity using diagrams and labels, classification keys, tables, scatter graphs, bar and line graphs.
- Use test results to make predictions to more investigations and ensure that these investigations are always comparative and fair.
- Report and present findings from investigations, include conclusions, casual relationships and explanations of degree of trust in results, in both an oral and written form such as displays and presentations.
- Identify that scientific evidence can be used to support or refute ideas and arguments.

- **Solar system:** Neptune, Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Earth, Sun, Moon, planet, star, space, solar system
- **Phases of the Moon:** waning gibbous, waxing gibbous, waxing crescent, waning crescent, last quarter, full Moon, first quarter, new moon
