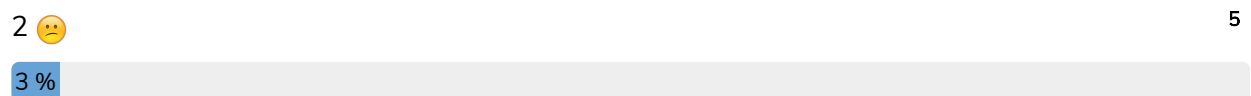
I think the current school uniform options need looking at and updating

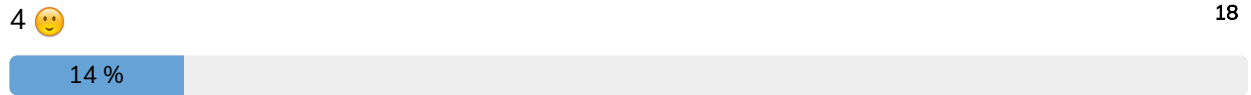

It would be simpler and cheaper for parents if the school phased out shirt and tie and just had polo tops

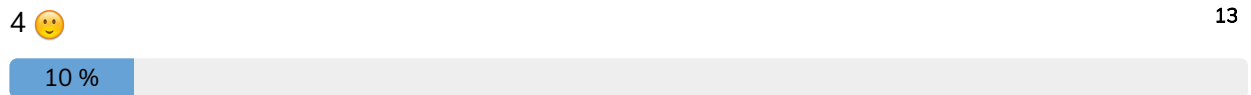
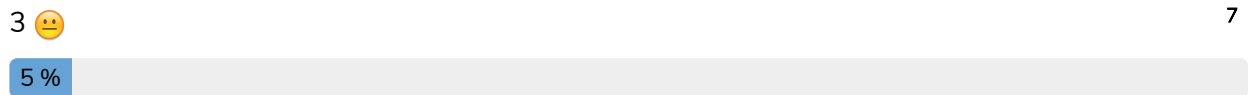
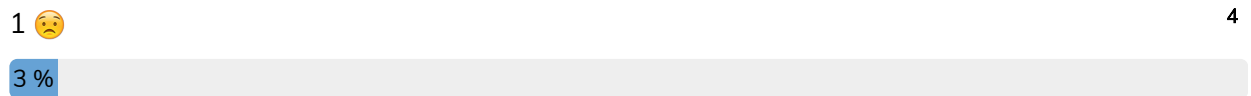

The current option of royal blue sweat shirt or cardigan is fine with or without logo and easy to access from local shops

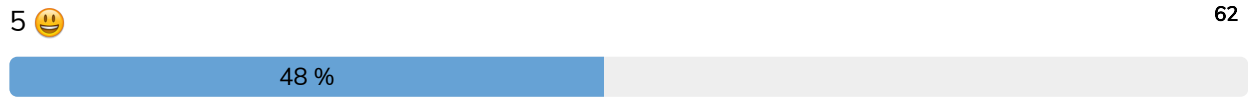
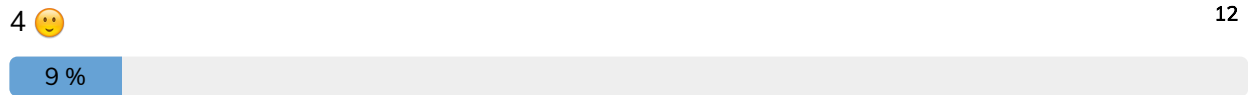
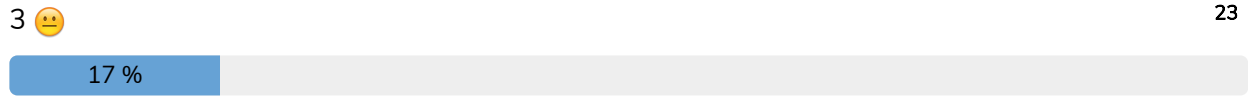

I think the uniform policy is very good compared to some other schools that expect parents to buy expensive items from select stores! School footwear should be sensible/practical and black in colour (in my opinion) with closed toe/no big logos/no jazzy bits (but not necessarily formal uncomfortable shoes).
